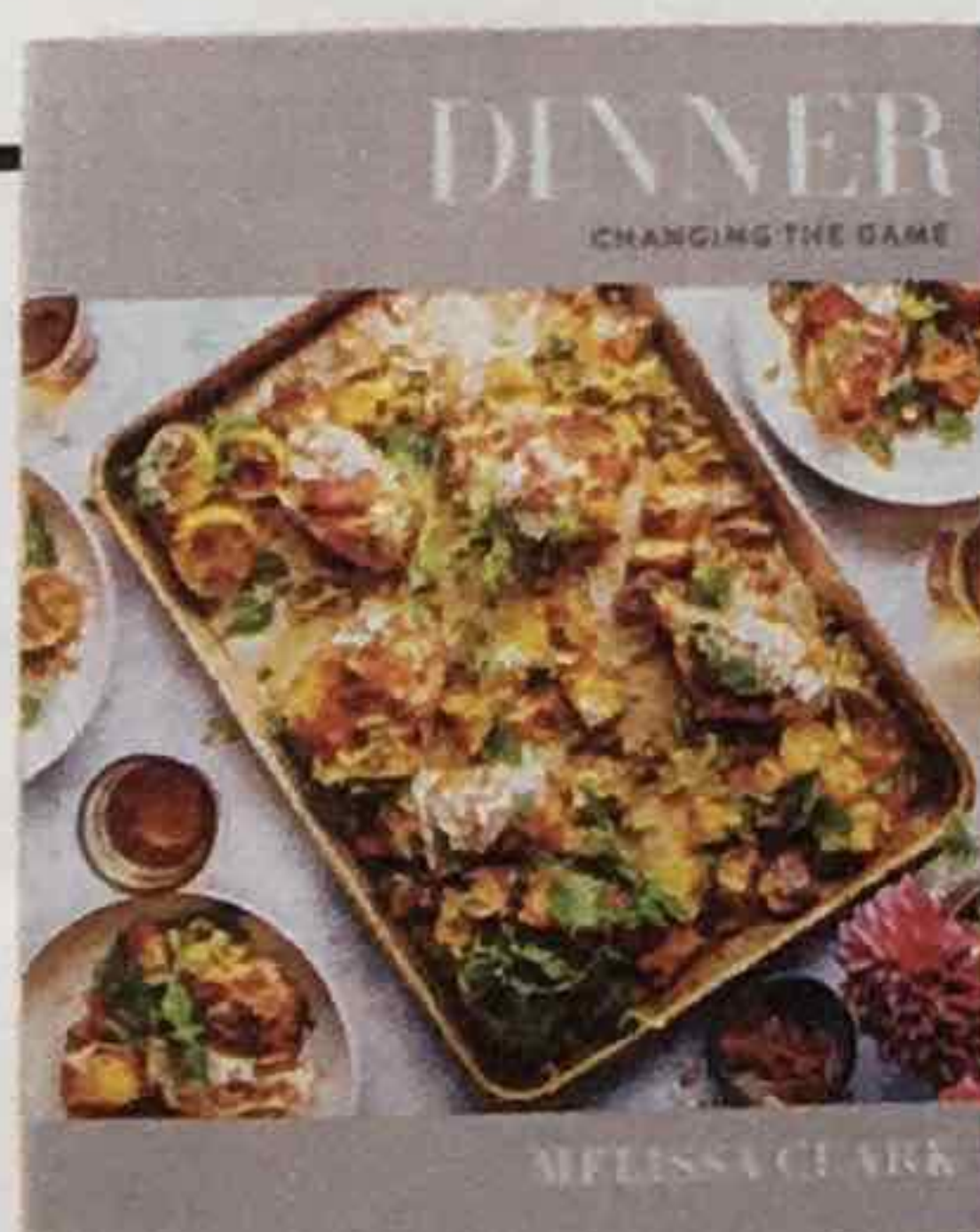
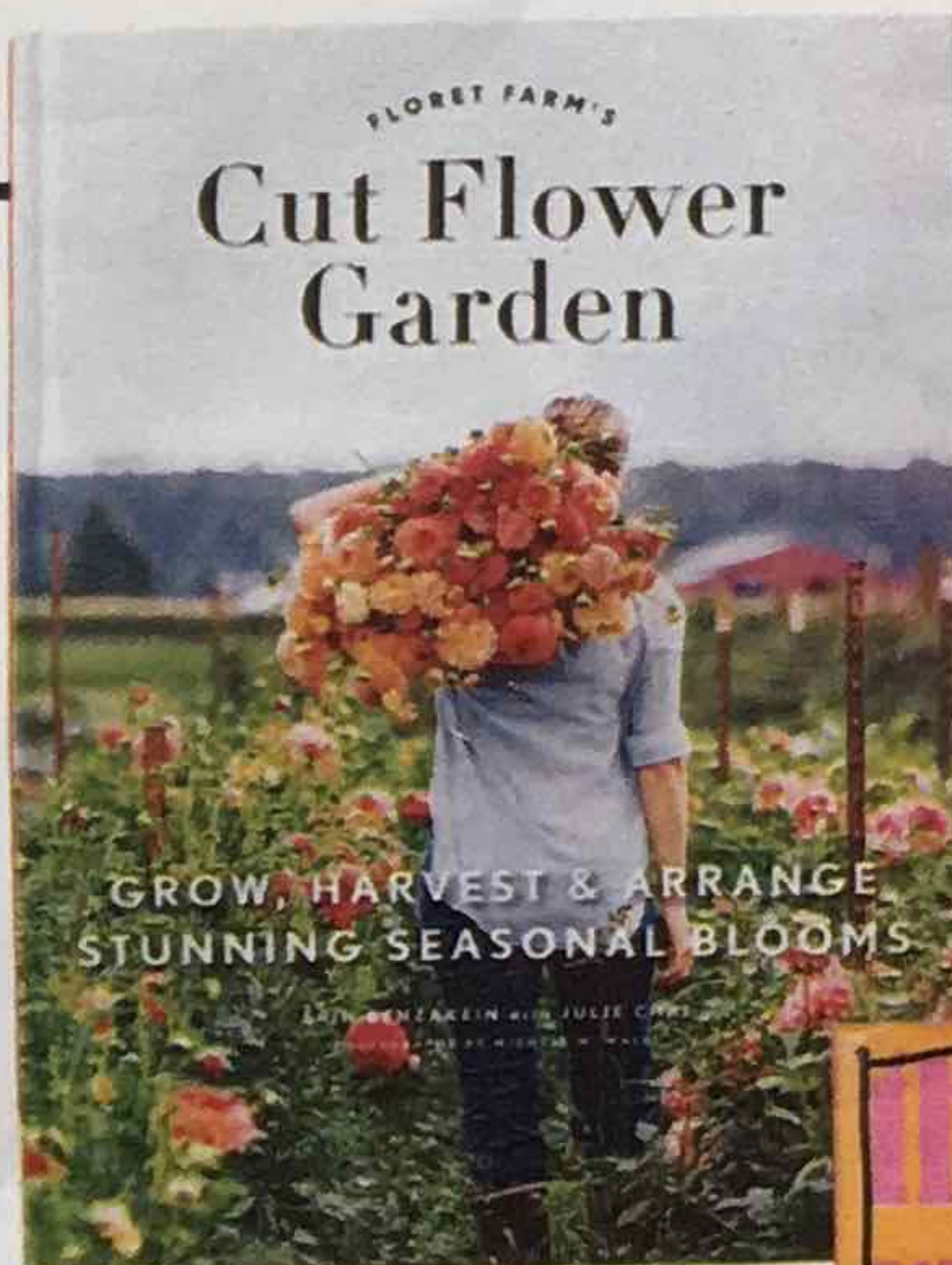

Any one of the nearly 250 rib-sticking recipes in Melissa Clark's new cookbook, *Dinner: Changing the Game* (Clarkson Potter), is sure to warm you. (We're eyeing her hearty pappardelle Bolognese with lentils and sausage.) A cold snap is a prime opportunity to sink into Ariel Levy's un-put-down-able memoir, *The Rules Do Not Apply* (Random House), in which the *New Yorker* writer recalls in elegaic detail how she had it all—home, marriage, baby—and survived losing it.
